I am getting back to you about the third and last project from the User Interfaces course.

The task is more open ended this time. You are asked to create a web form in HTML and Bootstrap. Your form should cover all elements of the template [1]. Your form should be functionally identical to the template but the actual layout and the graphical style is up to you (within the limits of the Bootstrap library, of course). Note that the design of your form should be visually pleasant and responsive, i.e. respond to different screen sizes.

To complete this project, you do not need any IDE. Any text editor capable of highlighting HTML syntax and modern web browser will be just fine.

The quick introduction to the Bootstrap layouts is here [2] (from the slide 164 onwards). I have also prepared a few examples of HTML pages you can start with [3]. I will update this file based on your requests from time to time. I highly suggest you to go through the Bootstrap manual [4], especially these parts: Layout, Content, Components, and Utilities. The manual is very well written and contains many practical examples so you can quickly find what you need. Although there are other useful resources, these three references should be sufficient for you to start.

The deadline for submitting the third project is May 12.
